Everything was handled by the Clinic; it made our lives so much easier while we were trying to figure out how to get our newborn the surgery he needed. We truly become part of their family, celebrating holidays, birthdays, and other important milestones together. This is an honor we do not take lightly. 



From Silence to the Spotlight:

Nine-year-old Eliberto shines as he belts out the words "Rock Star" while jamming with his friends during the Children's Clinics Adaptive Recreation Music program with Mr. Nature. You'd never guess how ill he was when he first arrived at the clinic. Born prematurely with a collapsed lung and bilateral hearing loss, Eliberto faced immense challenges from the start. "That was an incredibly difficult time," recalls his mother, Armelisa. "I was told he wouldn't be able to walk or talk. I was planning his funeral."

Eliberto came to Children's Clinics for life-saving feeding tube therapy, essential for his care at home. Armelisa vividly remembers those early sessions with Occupational Therapist Coleen Gilcrest, where Eliberto, in his stubborn way, would push his food right back out of the tube. "He was so ornery about it," she says with a smile.

A particularly unforgettable moment that Armelisa recalls was when Eliberto was first fitted for hearing aids at just six months old. "They put them on, and suddenly, I saw one big tear form in his eye. I knew then he could hear."

In the first few years of his life, Eliberto was at the clinic several times a week, receiving Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Audiology, Speech and Language Therapy, and seeing multiple specialists, including his ENT, cardiologist, and pulmonologist.

Armelisa reflects on the invaluable support she's received from the clinic and the connections she's made with other families. "It's been hard for my family to understand a child with special needs. But at the clinic, I've connected with other families who truly understand our challenges, and we support each other. The staff at the clinic

In the worst cases, children's hearing needs may go unmet, which is unacceptable to us at Children's Clinics, as well as to the Jim Click Family Foundation, which has generously provided funds to support families with audiology services.
